Youth Wellbeing Survey for Blaine Schools - Parent Opt In

As part of our effort to understand and meet the needs of students in our care, Blaine County School District has partnered with Communities for Youth, an Idaho-based organization focused on community-engaged promotion for student wellbeing. Part of their work with us includes surveying young people in our community. What we learn will help us prevent substance use and other things such as youth mental health challenges. The survey contains questions pertaining to several areas of wellbeing: Family, Schools, Community, Peers, Social Media use, Coping Skills, Substance Use, and Leisure Time. The results of this study will help adults come together to create safe and supportive environments for young people in our community. Your student's participation is very important to us, if you haven't already provided consent, please let us know and we can help you do so.

Although some of the questions can be about sensitive topics, we want you to rest assured that all surveys are completely anonymous and no answer can be tied back to your child. Also, your child will be able to skip any question for any reason. The survey is designed to take just one Advisory period and will provide insights and benefits to our whole community.

Once the survey is completed, Communities for Youth will provide data summaries to schools and will co-host meetings in our community so we can all build a shared understanding about the ways in which we can make Blaine County the best possible place for kids to grow up.

WRHS's National Merit Scholar Lucas Smith

The recognition as a semifinalist gives him the opportunity to continue in the Merit Scholarship competition and advance to Finalist standing by meeting a number of additional requirements. Finalists compete for 7,140 National Merit Scholarships worth nearly \$28 million. One of enduring goals of the NMSC is "to promote wider and deeper respect for learning in general and for exceptionally talented individuals in particular." WRHS's Commended Student in National Merit Scholarship Program Dionise Guerra-Carrillo

Dionise Guerra-Carrillo has been recognized as a Commended Student in the 2024 National Merit Scholarship Program. About 34,000 Commended Students throughout the nation are being recognized for their exceptional academic promise. Although they will not continue in the 2024 competition for National Merit Scholarship awards, Commended Students placed among the top 50,000 students who entered the 2024 competition by taking the 2022 PSAT/NMSQT test last October. We at WRHS are so proud of Dionise's amazing accomplishment!

There are 91 total AP Scholars for the 2022-23 year. including 48 students who graduated in 2023, 44 current seniors & 3 current juniors*.

The WRHS chapter achieved enough strength points to earn membership in the Association's prestigious 100 **Club**. The club award is remarkable because it demonstrates outstanding commitment to teaching students essential life skills - including communication, research, listening, writing, and organization.

The NSDA also commended the leadership of the WRHS Speech & Debate Team. We are grateful for the investment of Kevin Case - Speech/Debate Head Coach, Renee Tatterson -Assistant Speech/Debate Coach, and Hilary Biggers, Volunteer.

After last year's performances, WRHS's Speech/Debate team is ranked 7th in the state overall and first in the Gem of the Mountains District. We also have a couple individuals ranked in the state: Dionise Guerra-Carrillo is ranked 13th in the state in Lincoln-Douglas Debate and Ellis Rogers is ranked 18th in the state in Congressional Debate. Congratulations to our team!

The WRHS Debate Team competed in our season opener here at WRHS this past weekend had an outstanding first showing! Carter Thompson earned an 8th place overall in varsity division. In the novice division WRHS students placed as follows: Avie Nelson, 2nd place overall; Carson Bauer, 3rd place overall; Glenda Davis, 4th place overall; Benaiah Rosser, 5th place overall; James Kelley, 8th place overall. We were able to bring home 5 of the top 8 awards, all of the students competing in the novice divisions were competing at their first tournament!

WHY PSAT TESTING?

9th, 10th, and 11th Graders WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 18

WRHS 9th-11th students will be taking the Preliminary
Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT) on Wednesday, October 18.
9th graders will be taking the PSAT NMSQT (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test).



Why are we having students take the PSAT?

- With the ISATs no longer being taken in the 9th or 10th grade, WRHS needs to way to assess how we are doing, both nationally and vertically from 8th - 11th grade. The PSAT is a nationally normed test that helps us know if our students are learning in both Math and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing. The results come out in December, allowing us to analyze and adjust our instruction in the current school year. Since these results can be broken down to specific learning targets, core departments spend time scrutinizing the data to need to adjust our curriculum and focus.
- PSAT scores are used for placement in more advanced courses at Wood River High School. Some dual credit classes have a requirement of minimum scores for placement.
- The PSAT provides the following benefits to students:
 - Helps them identify strengths and weaknesses early in high school when they still have time to work on them
 - Helps them identify which AP and Dual Credit courses they are more likely to do well in.
 - Great practice for the 11th grade PSAT which qualifies students for the National Merit Scholarship Program and is a good predictor of SAT score the next spring
 - Great practice for other standardized tests for careers and the military like the Mechanical Aptitude Test and the ASVAB
 - Whether students are planning on a 4 year university, a 2 year community college, a skilled trade program (electrician) or the military, there is almost always a standardized test required for program placement, course placement or admission.
 - Can boost students' testing confidence and help them learn how to navigate a testing environment which makes testing less stressful



This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers.

If you've ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 46999, you have used short code texting.
