
### SILVER CREEK HIGH SCHOOL


Craig's presence will be deeply missed, but his legacy of connection, compassion, and belief in every student will live on in the halls of Silver Creek and beyond.





Looking ahead, Amy is ready to relax, travel, spend quality time with family, and most importantly —NOT GRADE ANYTHING!


